The Bancroft Early Intervention Program's support families of children birth to three years old within the New Jersey Early Intervention System. The program is targeted to those who require educational, behavioral, therapeutic or social services to promote developmental growth.

Bancroft recognizes that this early diagnosis and intervention time can be very difficult on families. Our Bancroft staff are highly qualified and committed professionals who collaborate as a team with the families, community agencies and The New Jersey Early Intervention System to provide a cohesive approach to the child's development process, work together to meet the developmental outcomes stated in The Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) and offer resources and training to the family to assist with their daily routines.

Services are provided according to the family's availability and preference of location:
